



WESTERN SUFFOLK BOCES REGIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT 2015-2024

During the historical period 2015 - 2021, there was an overall 10.4% decline (8,484 students) in enrollment in the Western Suffolk BOCES region - from a period high of 81,791 students in 2015 to a period low of 73,307 students in 2021. Declines were recorded in all grade configurations: the elementary (K - 5) grade configuration recorded a loss of 9.2% (3,122 students); the middle (6 - 8) and high school (9 - 12) grades recorded losses of 11.4% (2,223 students) and 10.9% (3,024 students), respectively, during this period. The most significant year-to-year decline of the historical period was between 2019 and 2020, with a loss of 2,332 students, or 3.0; this has been attributed to the pandemic.

Smithtown remains the district with the largest enrollment (7,937 students), while Babylon is the smallest district, with 1,516 students. Between 2020 and 2021, enrollment remained stable (change of less than 1.5%) in nine districts, while losses of 1.6 - 3.8% were recorded in eight districts; a gain was noted in one district (Cold Spring Harbor). For the six years between 2015 and 2021, a gain was recorded in one district (9.4% in Wyandanch), while losses ranging from 3.1 to 20.0 percent were recorded in all other districts.

Overall regional enrollment is projected to further decline by 2,437 students (3.3%) over the next three years.

The elementary (K - 5) enrollment is projected to remain relatively stable over the next three years, with a loss of 245 students, or 0.8 percent, between 2021 and 2024.

The middle grades (6 - 8) enrollment is projected to decline by 5.5% over the next three years, with a loss of 938 students between 2021 and 2024.

The secondary (9 - 12) enrollment is projected to decline by 5.1%, or 1,251 students, between 2021 and 2024.

Lower birth levels result in smaller kindergarten cohorts. Suffolk County births have declined 27% during the last two decades, dropping from 20,248 births in 2000 to 14,742 births in 2020. Consequently, a similar pattern has been seen in kindergarten enrollment in the Western Suffolk BOCES region. Total regional enrollment is expected to continue to decline as exiting twelfth grade classes will be replaced by significantly smaller entering kindergarten classes.

New housing construction or the re-sale of existing homes is one of the contributing factors when analyzing potential school enrollment. Records show increases in housing sales between 2019 and 2020 in two towns - Huntington (+2%) and Smithtown (+5%), while housing turnover in the Town of Babylon declined 2% during this period. Increases in the median sale prices of 5 - 9% were recorded in the three towns between 2019 and 2020. Recent growth in median sale prices in many areas has been attributed to strong buyer demand and a lack of available inventory.

During the last five years, the Western Suffolk BOCES Office of School Planning & Research has conducted over 200 planning studies for school districts on Long Island and in the Hudson Valley region. Comprehensive Long Range Planning Studies include analysis of demographic factors that have influenced historical enrollment or have the potential to impact future enrollment.
